Employment Notice

The Guadalupe County Constable's Office Precinct 3, under Constable Jeff Large, is looking for an experienced Reserve Deputy Constable.

This position will include duties related to civil law enforcement, bailiff services, warrant research and service, and routine patrol to prevent crime and enforce applicable laws. Responsibilities also include working special events; responding to emergency calls and routine complaints; issuing traffic citations; pursuing and apprehending suspects; conducting investigations; making arrests; collecting, documenting, and preserving evidence; guarding and transporting prisoners; and providing testimony in court.

We are seeking individuals who are willing to donate their time, skills, and experience to serve the community as Reserve Officers. Reserve Officers may work independently or alongside another officer. Applicants must be willing to provide all required personal equipment. A department vehicle will be provided to qualified individuals while on duty. Applicant must be a licensed peace officer with the State of Texas prior to application. At least an Intermediate Peace Officer License is preferred. Reserve Officers serve under the direction of the Constable and full-time officers. Ideal candidates are level-headed, professional, and committed to representing the department in a positive manner at all times. Reserve Officers are required to work a minimum of 16 hours per month and may also be assigned to special community events as needed.

This is an unpaid (reserve) position. This position will remain open until filled.

Applications may be obtained from the county's website (www.guadalupe.tx.gov) or from the Human Resource Office located at 211 W. Court St., Seguin, TX. Please submit completed application/background packet with Constable Jeff Large at the Precinct 3 Constable's Office. Any transfer request by an employee of a higher pay group will be considered as a request for demotion, and therefore a reduction in pay.
