The City of Schertz has filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10645 and sewer CCN No. 20271 for the provision of retail water and sewer utility service in Guadalupe County.

The requested area is located approximately <u>1.27</u> miles <u>northwest</u> of downtown Schertz, Texas. and is generally bounded on the north by <u>Savannah Drive</u>; on the east by the intersection of Maske Road and Oak Street; on the south by <u>the intersection of FM 1518 and Windy Meadows Drive</u>; and on the west by <u>Suncliff D</u>rive. The total requested area includes approximately <u>67</u> acres and .Q current customers.

See enclosed map showing the requested area.

<u>The requested area overlaps the boundaries of Cibolo Creek Municipal Authority</u>. If Cibolo Creek Municipal Authority does not request a public hearing, the Commission shall determine that the district is consenting to the City of Schertz's request to provide retail water and sewer utility service in the requested area.

Persons who wish to intervene in the proceeding or comment upon action sought should contact the Public Utility Commission, P.O. Box 13326, Austin, Texas 78711-3326, or call the Public Utility Commission at (512) 936-7120 or (888) 782-8477. Hearing- and speech-impaired individuals with text telephones (ITY) may contact the commission at (512) 936-7136. The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is (30 days from the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later, unless otherwise provided by the presiding officer). You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

A landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from the requested area ("opt out") within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the Utility. All opt out requests must include a large scale map and a metes and bounds description of the landowner's tract of land.
