Environment: Protecting and restoring the environment to promote community well-being; and

Whereas, since its inception, the New Braunfels Noon Lions Club has sponsored the formation of 25 additional Lions Clubs in Central Texas; and this initiative has strengthened communities in Guadalupe County and beyond through fundraising and extensive volunteer service to various local organizations and events, demonstrating a commitment to positively impacting the lives of residents.
